After sailing through the Northwest Passage with "Gjøa" in 1903–1906, Amundsen planned an expedition to the North Pole. He borrowed Nansen's ship "Fram" and equipped it for a North Pole voyage. However, after receiving the news that Robert Peary had reached the pole, he chose to focus on the South Pole. Amundsen feared that Nansen would take back "Fram" if he learned of the changed plans, and therefore only told his brother and the captain onboard "Fram" that the South Pole was the destination. Only when "Fram" arrived in Madeira did Amundsen tell the rest of the crew about the plans. They all chose to follow Amundsen to Antarctica. That Amundsen brought this set of the Norwegian first edition of Nansen's «Farthest North» (the Norwegian title is «With Fram over the Polar Sea») on all his journeys, including the South Pole Expedition, makes this a highly unique polar object.



Hjalmar Johansen [1867-1913] was the only person to take part in both Nansen's exploration towards the North Pole and Amundsen's exploration towards the South Pole. Johansen had a drinking problem and thrived best when working hard out in the cold during expeditions. So, when Amundsen asked to borrow Fram, Nansen pushed him to take Johansen with hom on the planned North Pole expedition in 1910, which instead became a South Pole expedition. During the expedition Johansen claimed Amundsen for taking too big risks, setting his crew in danger. Amundsen, not tolerating to be corrected in this way, removed Johansen from the group which was to set towards the South Pole. When the expedition arrived in Hobart, Tasmania, on its return journey, he asked Amundsen to be allowed to travel directly home, and he was given money to do so. Amundsen was intransigent and sent a letter home with instructions that Johansen was not to be welcomed as a hero. Six months later, on 3 January 1913, Johansen shot himself at Solli Plass in Kristiania (Oslo).

The fact that Amundsen has written his name in Hjalmar Johansen's account on being the first to reach the North Pole, with Nansen, makes this a highly unique polar object.

He was a radical anti-unionist and nationalist and argued for Norway's equality with Sweden. The Union was officially dissolved on June 7, 1905, the same date as the inscription.


Johann Christian Ernst Walter (Ratzeburg 1799 – Ordrup, Denmark 1860) is in the literature listed as Danish painter, engraver and lithograph. But he is remembered for his illustrated natural history books. His works are in general influenced by the growing interest and knowledge concering all life on earth through the 18th Century. From 1828 he started no less than three different plate book projects, the third «Nordisk Ornithologi» is regarded as his major achievement.

The book was published in parts; 60 plates in volume I from 1828-29, title-page with list of subscribers verso, a systematical list, and text to each plate. A dedication to Frederik VI called for by Anker is not present. Volume II «Ny Fölge» 1832-33; title-page, systematical list, dedication leaf to Count Moltke, 60 plates with text. Third and last part «Nyeste Fölge» 1835-41; title-page, systematical list, and 120 plates (of a total 168 published in this part).

Copies of Walter's «Nordisk Ornithologi» are rarely seen on the market, and the few examples recorded are almost never complete. According to Anker the number of printed copies was very limited and subsequently it failed economically. The print run was decided by the number of subscribers but only 69 signed up. Among the subscribers were the King (6 copies) and the Queen (3). The subscription price was substantial, 3 Riksdaler per part, and 4 if purchased in the book shop. Few people in Scandinavia could afford this in early 1800. Because the publication went on for several years many of the subscribers cancelled the order. This can explain why most copies known are lacking portions of the last parts. Even Library or Institution copies are more often than not incomplete.

Along with William Fearnside, the English artist John William Edy made a tour along the coastline of Southern Norway from Lindesnes to Svinesund in 1800. This in order to draw sketches for a scheduled colour-plate book initiated by the famous book publisher Boydell in London. It was war in Europe and four weeks after their arrival in Norway the two English gentlemen were arrested suspected of espionage. After a month they were released from the "custody" and were able to continue the journey. Based on Edy's drawings, the publishing of the printed views in parts started in 1811 and continued to 1815 before the complete work with text was finished between 1817 and 1820. As a complete book it was published the same year. A "second issue" with trimmed margins and more heavily illuminated plates was published c. 1830. As far as the small towns and places along the coast of the Southern part of Norway are concerned, Edy's views are the earliest printed.





Wilhelm M. Carpelan is together with Johannes Flintoe (Copenhagen 1787 – 1870) one of the pioneers among the artists who "discovered" the scenery in Southern Norway after 1814. He was educated as an officer, painter and engraver in Stockholm. He came to Norway in 1819 as adjutant for Count Sandels, the deputy for Carl XIV. The summer 1819, Count Sandels and Carpelan and their crew travelled from Christiania, through Krokkleiva, Valdres and Filefjell down to Lærdal. From here they continued with boat to Bergen. On this travel Carpelan observed the spectacular Norwegian mountain scenery and used the opportunity to draw several pioneer works. In 1820 he travelled to Telemark and Carpelan and again he drew some iconic pictures. Between 1821 and 1823 in Christiania, he transferred his own drawings to copperplates through the aquatint technique as well as using some sketches of Johannes Flintoe and Baltzar Keilhau. The book was printed and published in Stockholm with the flourishing title "Voyage pittoresque aux Alpes Norvegiennes" (when presented to the king, it had to be in French, but a few sets were also published in Swedish). In May 1820, Carpelan and Flintoe exhibited 44 art works from their travels in the Norwegian mountains in the summer of 1819. This Exhibition can be regarded as the first serious attempt of the National Romantism in the art history of Norway.





Joseph Paul Gaimard was educated in medicine and worked as a naval surgeon. But his general interest in natural history gave him the position as leader of the scientific expedition «La Recherche», named after the expedition's main ship. The huge exploring project was financed and supported by the French government as well as by King Louis Philippe personally. Among the people on board were famous artists and several important scientists. The project inspired the King to invite Peder Balke to Louvre. The project soon became an international expedition as they hired people from the different countries where the ship harbored. The work remains as the most extensive lithographic work on Scandinavia, Spitsbergen, Iceland, Russia, and the Baltic countries.

In Schiøtz «Itineraria Norvegica. Foreigner's trvalels in Norway» volumes 1 and 2 we can follow the complete and impressive travelling route by all the participants during the years 1838 – 40.

AN IMPRESSIVE COLLECTION OF PLATES: Including topographical views, maps, tables, plates of different animals and fishes, shells, geological images and other scientific material. Not less important are the plates illustrating folklore, including the Sami people. There are portraits and interior scenes as well as pictures of the camps and their homes. The extensive text volumes describe and explain many of the plates and examine several complicated scientific issues. The topographical prints were mostly based on drawings made on the spot by the French artists. Auguste Mayer, Charles Giraud, Barthelemy Lauvergne and Francois Biard and depicting from south: Hamburg, Denmark, Faeroes, Norway with 98 views from Christiania to the North Cape including 40 from Northern Norway and Lapland, Spitsbergen (Svalbard) and Bear Island 27 plates, Sweden, Finland, Russia with Moscow, Poland and the Baltic countries. THE COMPLETE SET OF 450 PLATES. It has been estimated that the total print run could be as few as c.150 copies. Several copies are in institutions or in public libraries and many have been broken or split.

Per Hierta's incomplete copy was sold in Stockholm in 1932. Hierta also states he has seen three copies of the book sold, two in Sweden and Denmark, all of which were incomplete. "Even the Fiske copy is incomplete." (Professor Daniel Willard Fiske, his copy donated to Cornell Library in 1904.

Thesaurus states that one of these may have been the copy offered for 30 000 in Oslo 1982 (Auction ex Engelschiøn, now in Tønsberg Library).

Per Hierta's copy was sold in 1932 to Gustav Raabe. This copy was in 2000s sold through Damms Antikvariat to the National Library in Oslo and is apparently one of two incomplete copies in the institution. In cooperation with bibliophile rare book history registrator Torfinn Jåsund, we have neither no information to trace any other complete copy in private hands, nor be sure there is any institutional complete copy.
